# On The Bit

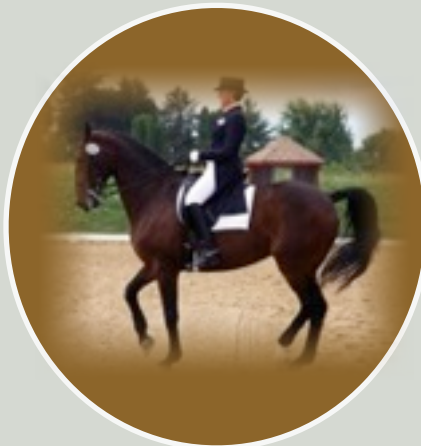

Husband: Art

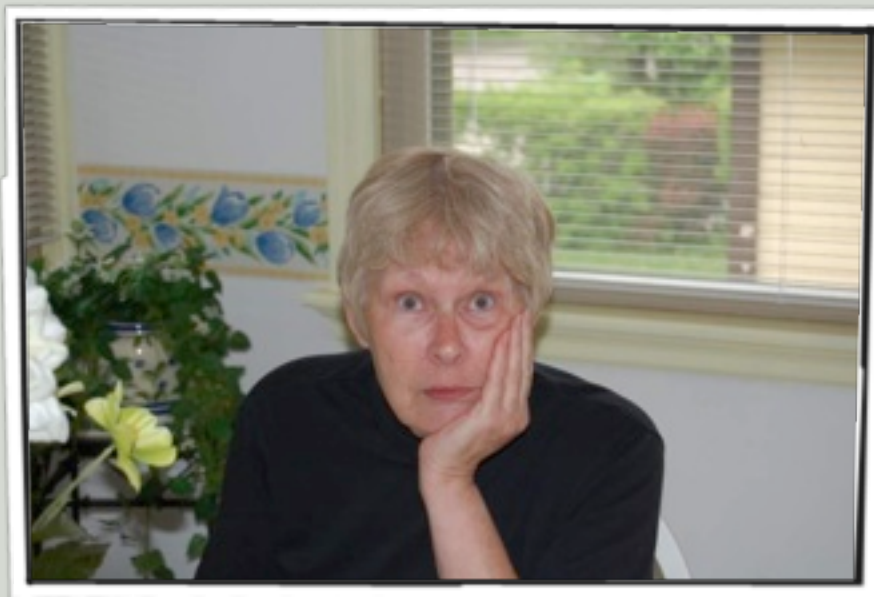
**Other pets besides horses?**

# Just Do It

## Judging Standards: Learning Them and Keeping Them

I may have escaped the tail-end of a Wisconsin winter, but there was no escaping the strong message from Axel Steiner, the “O” judge who led the Dressage Judge’s Clinic March 10-11 in Del Mar, California.

Axel’s repeated message was: No matter if it’s a schooling or recognized show, a local or an international championship, competitors must be judged according to **one** standard.

“It doesn’t matter if it is Suzy Q on a cute spotted pony or a big-name rider, each must be judged on the same standard,” says Axel. “Judges are the guardians of the sport.”

### Real Judges, Plus Two

I was fortunate to get into the Dressage Judge’s Clinic because priority is given to recognized judges over L graduates (and rightfully so, as recognized judges must attend continuing education sessions to keep their licenses).

Our group consisted of all recognized judges, except for two of us L graduates. Attending the clinic and being surrounded by judges with much more experience and

skill could have been an intimidating experience. However, the opposite turned out to be the case. The recognized judges were supportive and encouraging. And, interesting to me: Even some of the judges appeared to be somewhat shy or reluctant to judge out-loud in front of their peers. (I must admit, that made me feel less nervous!)

On the first day, I was the third one asked to judge a test out-loud. It was a Training Level test. The feedback I received was that I did fine on the test, but was a bit too tough on the rider in the collective marks.

On Sunday, I was asked to judge a Prix St. George test. I pointed out I was “only” an “L” graduate, but Axel didn’t let me off the hook.

“You’ve been listening all weekend,” he said. “You can do it.”

Turns out, I actually thought judging Prix St. George was easier to judge than Second Level!

### Weekend Highlights

The best part of the weekend was getting VIP seats for the Saturday evening CDI Grand Prix for the Special and the CDI Grand Prix Freestyles. We had headsets and listened to Axel comment on all the rides. I personally enjoyed practicing in my head the score and comment I would have given and hearing if it matched with Axel’s assessment.

The top four finishers for the GP Special:  
1 – Steffen Peters on Ravel 79.213%  
2 – Sue Blinks on Robin Hood 68.957%  
3 – Guenter Seidel on Frandango 68.234%  
4 – Kathleen Raine on Breanna 65.511%

For the Grand Prix Freestyles, finishing first and second, respectively, were Steffen Peters on his new horse, Legolas 43 with 78.225% and Jan Ebeling on Rafalca with 74.800%.

On Sunday, we judged classes including Third Level and the FEI Young Horse classes. In the afternoon, Axel had to take off his teaching hat so he could sit at H and judge the FEI Olympic Grand Prix Special. The great thing about this was we were again able to view the tests from the VIP seats and listen to Axel over our headsets as he made comments to his scribe.

The top four finishers for the Olympic Grand Prix Special:

- 1 – Steffen Peters on Ravel 80.289%
- 2 – Guenter Seidel on Frandango 70.422%
- 3 – Kathleen Raine on Breanna 70.400%
- 4 – Sue Blinks on Robin Hood 69.600%

### Axel Steiner Observations and Advice

Following are some tips and comments from Axel that could be helpful not only to judges (or aspiring judges) but also to competitors:

*“Always look at the purpose of the test when you start judging a test.”* (This is important for riders to note too. What is the test trying to demonstrate? What are the requirements expected at that particular level?)

*“A halt has three seconds of immobility.”*

*“The stretchy circle is not judged by the inch.”*

*“At second level, the biggest deal is the collection. The dreaded ‘C’ word. How much collection is required? Enough to do the job. It is not the collection required at FEI.”*

*“The canter is the most important aspect of the pirouette. Ideally the horse is straight coming into the pirouette and straight coming out.”*

*“Shoulder-in to renvers is a suppling and balancing exercise and a preparation for half-pass.”*



**As you walked on the path on the way to the food stand, a well-known trainer/ competitor's tent was visible.**

*“There are six to eight strides in a full canter pirouette. Don't get too hung up on counting strides – as long as there are at least six.”*

*“Just as you can give an 8, you must be able to give a 3, 2 or 1. Everyone wants to be nice, but that's not fair to the rider. You must use the range. You must be honest.”*

*“Chances are, one of the pirouettes will be better than the other. Be sure you differentiate between them. The riders know.”*

*“If a walk gets lateral only in the collected work, address it in submission. If you see the walk is lateral elsewhere during the test, then do note the problem in gaits – but you must mention that you saw it.”*

*“Look for the ‘Grand Prix’ attitude in a horse. As they come down centerline, you should get the impression the horse is saying, ‘I am here. I am an athlete.’ No head low, my rider is making me be here.”*

*“Training level is the biggest conundrum in dressage, especially for the rider. That's why the score and comments for the rider in the collectives are so important. A rider may receive a 62% and think they are not that good. That may not be the case. It may mean they are doing a good job, but their horse may be limited. But we can't change the judging standards based on a horse's competitiveness. We need to judge to one standard.”*

*“The first horse you judge dictates the standard for the entire class, so be careful. And stick to what you set as the standard for that class.”*

*“We now have beautifully bred horses showing in Training through Second Level classes that are legitimately working at or near an 80% score. When deserved, give it to them!”*

*“As soon as you start worrying about what another judge is scoring on a panel, you're in trouble.”*

*“When things go wrong in the ring, don't get flustered or panic. Stuff happens. Keep scoring and stay calm.”*

*“Your heart rate shouldn't go up when you give a score of a one. Don't get emotional. Move on.”*

*“Don't write the great American novel in your comments.”*

Elaborating on the last point, Axel said tongue in cheek to the “L” graduates and the new, small “r” judges: *“Keep your comments brief. The more you write, the more there's the chance we'll know you don't know what you are talking about.”*

# USDF Instructor Certification Program Coming to this Area by Popular Demand

The United States Dressage Federation's (USDF) Instructor Certification program is designed to educate dressage instructors and aspiring riders/instructors, who demonstrate the knowledge and abilities necessary to teach the classical concepts of dressage and meet USDF-specified proficiency standards.

The USDF offers certification at the National Levels in the following areas: Certified Instructor – Training through First Levels, Certified Instructor – Second Level, and Certified Instructor – Third through Fourth.

## Certification Involves Several Aspects

Certification is achieved through attendance at a series of USDF workshops, followed by a mock-testing (called Pre-Certification) and then a final test for USDF National Certification.

Participants must attend three categories of workshops: Lungeing, Riding and Teaching.

Participants must be certified in Basic First Aid by the American Red Cross before certification. In addition to attending the workshops, pre-certification and testing, participants have recommended reading to help prepare for their final exam.

e-TRAK, USDF's online learning center for dressage and equine education, offers

in-depth study courses based on the USDF Lungeing, Training and Teaching Manuals, as well as the lungeing video used in the workshop curriculum. Candidates are encouraged to complete these courses.

The workshops provide a wonderful learning opportunity for students at all levels, from beginners in dressage to advanced Grand Prix riders, to learn classical theory of riding, training, lungeing and teaching. The workshops provide an intensive training experience for instructors



and aspiring instructors to assess and further their practical skill level. As only eight participants are allowed, each candidate receives concentrated instruction from the faculty instructor.



The workshops are taught by USDF faculty and examiners, all of whom are highly respected trainers and instructors in the United States, and many of them are USEF dressage judges as well.

So just who is a USDF Certified Instructor? Some notable names are Olympian Courtney King-Dye, Christopher Hickey and Michael Bragdell from Hilltop Farm, Jennifer Baumert, plus many, many others!

Faculty members include Maryal Barnett, Gerhard Politz, Cindy Sydnor, Liselotte Fore, Sarah Geikie and Michael Poulin.

The USDF Instructor Program has become very popular, with workshops and testing held all over the U.S. Faculty members are in high demand, as many of our nation's top dressage trainers are seeking national certification through this program.

## WDCTA to Host Program

WDCTA is hosting the first three workshops of the USDF Instructor Certification program in late 2012 and 2013.

The first workshop will be the Lungeing workshop at Sunflower Farms in Bristol WI, Nov. 10-11. This workshop will be taught

by Sarah Geikie, Lebanon, CT. Sarah is the first person to have completed the entire Instructor Program and then become program faculty and recently a USDF certified examiner. Sarah holds a Bachelor of Science degree in animal science, is a British Horse Society assistant instructor, and became a USDF Fourth Level certified instructor in 1995. As a firm believer in continuing education, she went on to become a member of the USDF instructor certification faculty. Sarah also has earned her USDF bronze and silver medals. She is also a USEF "S" dressage judge and was promoted to FEI "C" dressage judge in 2007. Sarah is an incredibly popular clinician, and we're

very happy to have her as our faculty for the Lungeing Workshop.

# UP Chapter Hosts Large Animal Emergency Rescue Clinic ... Plus Other Chapter News

WDCTA's Upper Peninsula Chapter held a Trailer Safety Clinic Sunday, May 13 at the UP Equestrian Center, Gwinn, MI with presenters, John Izzi of Escanaba and Cathy Ruprecht of Gwinn.



John and Cathy took turns explaining the correct ways to safely hook up a horse trailer whether a gooseneck or bumper pull. We had several trailers to use for a hands-on demonstration on what to look for in a safe trailer and what to do in an emergency. Cathy also gave us information on safe animal rescue. Read her article below:

## TECHNICAL LARGE ANIMAL EMERGENCY RESCUE by Cathy Ruprecht

Large animals fall into holes, are involved in trailer accidents, become stuck in mud and many other perilous predicaments. The well-intended rescuer may think tying a line onto any appendage and pulling with large equipment would be the way to achieve the rescue, but this may be putting the animal and rescuer at risk for serious injury or death.

An organization started for human emergency rescue personnel and others has been teaching the right things to do in these types of animal emergencies. Tomas M. Gimenez, MVZ (DVM) and his wife, Rebecca Gimenez, Ph.D, and Major in the U.S. Army Reserves, have designed equipment, trained live animals to be subjects of rescue, and developed courses to teach these life-saving techniques.

Classes at the Technical level are for fire fighters, EMTs, police organizations, and

search and rescue groups. Classes at the Operations level are for horse/livestock owners, veterinarian staff and others.

Having participated in the course as a horse owner several years ago, I found the course well organized with hands-on rescue performance, using large animals in rescue simulation. The level of efficiency, organization and simplicity of equipment used in rescues was amazing.

Many pieces of rescue equipment could be manufactured from the hardware store, did not require much space and were not elaborate or costly.

The most valuable lesson from the course was that having a local team of emergency response personnel trained in Large Animal Emergency Rescue was the best way to have professional assistance in an animal emergency.

This book provides rescue tips and makes a great gift for your local fire and police departments, veterinarians, and search and rescue groups.

Horse owners are not trained, nor equipped for the unexpected dangerous situations in which our horses and livestock may find themselves. The Upper Peninsula Chapter of the WDCTA has graciously offered to explore options to partner with other horse clubs in the Upper Peninsula for fund-raising purposes. Funds could be used to send rescue personnel to one of these courses so a local large animal rescue team could be formed.

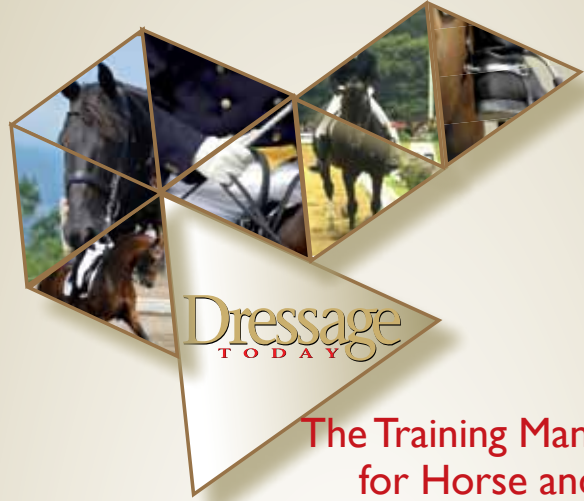
